

**SUBSTITUTE FOR THE AMENDMENT IN THE
NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H. RES. 446
OFFERED BY MR. GAETZ OF FLORIDA**

Strike all that follows after the resolving clause and
insert the following:

1 That it is the sense of the House of Representatives that
2 a special counsel should be appointed by the Attorney
3 General or his designee to investigate the following:

4 (1) Then-Attorney General Loretta Lynch di-
5 recting James B. Comey to mislead the American
6 people by stating that he should refer to the inves-
7 tigation into the mishandling of classified data and
8 use of an unauthorized email server by former Sec-
9 retary of State Hillary Clinton as a “matter”, rather
10 than a criminal “investigation”.

11 (2) Leaks by James B. Comey to Columbia
12 University law professor, Daniel Richman, regarding
13 conversations had between President Donald Trump
14 and then-FBI Director James B. Comey, and how
15 the leaked information was purposefully released to
16 lead to the appointment of special counsel, Robert
17 Mueller, a longtime friend of James B. Comey.

1 (3) The propriety and consequence of immunity
2 deals given to possible Hillary Clinton co-conspira-
3 tors Cheryl Mills, Heather Samuelson, John Bentel,
4 and potentially others, by the Federal Bureau of In-
5 vestigation, during the criminal investigation James
6 B. Comey led into Hillary Clinton's misconduct.

7 (4) The decision by James B. Comey to usurp
8 the authority of then-Attorney General Loretta
9 Lynch in his unusual announcement that criminal
10 charges would not be brought against Hillary Clin-
11 ton following her unlawful use of a private email
12 server and mishandling of classified information.

13 (5) James B. Comey's knowledge and impres-
14 sions of any ex-parte conversation between then-At-
15 torney General Loretta Lynch and former President
16 Bill Clinton on June 27, 2016, at a Phoenix airport
17 on a private jet.

18 (6) James B. Comey's knowledge of the com-
19 pany "Fusion GPS", including—

20 (A) its creation of a "dossier" of informa-
21 tion about Mr. Donald Trump;

22 (B) that dossier's commission and dissemi-
23 nation in the months before and after the 2016
24 Presidential Election; and

1 (C) the intelligence sources of Fusion GPS
2 or any person or company working for Fusion
3 GPS or its affiliates.

4 (7) Any and all potential leaks originated by
5 James B. Comey and provided to author Michael
6 Schmidt dating back to 1993.

7 (8) James B. Comey's knowledge of—

8 (A) the purchase of a majority stake in the
9 company Uranium One by the company
10 Rosatom;

11 (B) whether the approval of the sale was
12 connected to any donations made to the Clinton
13 Foundation;

14 (C) what role then-Secretary of State Hil-
15 lary Clinton played in the approval of that sale;
16 and

17 (D) whether the sale could have affected
18 the national security of the United States of
19 America.

20 (9) James B. Comey's refusal to investigate
21 then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton regarding—

22 (A) selling access to the U.S. State De-
23 partment through Clinton Foundation dona-
24 tions;

1 (B) Huma Abedin's dual employment at
2 the State Department and the Clinton Founda-
3 tion simultaneously; or

4 (C) utilization of the State Department to
5 further paid speaking opportunities for her hus-
6 band.

7 (10) Any collusion between former FBI Direc-
8 tor James B. Comey and special counsel Robert
9 Mueller; including—

10 (A) the information James B. Comey ad-
11 mitted to leaking to the Columbia University
12 law professor, being intentional such that a spe-
13 cial counsel, his longtime friend, Robert
14 Mueller, would be appointed to lead the inves-
15 tigation against the Trump administration; and

16 (B) any communication between Robert
17 Mueller and James B. Comey in advance of the
18 Senate Intelligence Committee hearing.

19 (11) Whether James B. Comey had any knowl-
20 edge of—

21 (A) efforts made by any federal agency—

22 (i) to monitor communications of
23 then-candidate Donald Trump;

24 (ii) to assess any knowledge by James
25 B. Comey about the “unmasking” of indi-

1 viduals on Donald Trump's campaign
2 team, transition team, or both;

3 (iii) to assess the role that former Na-
4 tional Security Adviser Susan Rice played
5 in the unmasking of these individuals; or

6 (iv) to reveal the purpose served by
7 unmasking any individual or individuals
8 serving on the staff of then-candidate Don-
9 ald Trump; or

10 (B) the dissemination of unredacted infor-
11 mation to various intelligence agencies, and any
12 attempts to use surveillance of then-candidate
13 Donald Trump for the purposes of damaging
14 the credibility of his campaign, his presidency,
15 or both.

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
