

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 4170**

**OFFERED BY MR. JOHNSON OF LOUISIANA**

Page 32, beginning line 3, strike “The Attorney General” and insert “Not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Attorney General”.

Page 33, beginning line 2, strike “regular, ongoing”.

Page 33, strike lines 12 through 17 and insert the following:

1           (2) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—The Inspector  
2           General of the Department of Justice shall submit  
3           a report to the appropriate committees of Congress  
4           on the results of the review carried out under para-  
5           graph (1) not later than 1 year after the date upon  
6           which the comprehensive strategy described in sub-  
7           section (a) is implemented by the Attorney General.  
8           (c) ANNUAL REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later  
9           than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act,  
10          and annually thereafter, the Attorney General, in con-  
11          sultation with the Assistant Attorney General for National  
12          Security, shall submit a report to the appropriate commit-  
13          tees of Congress detailing the usage over the preceding  
14          year of the authority granted to the Attorney General by

1 this Act and the amendments made by this Act to issue  
2 civil investigative demands, including—

3 (1) the number of civil investigative demands  
4 issued;

5 (2) a description of the nature of the conduct  
6 constituting the alleged violation of the Foreign  
7 Agents Registration Act of 1938 (22 U.S.C. 611 et  
8 seq.) which was under investigation and the provi-  
9 sion alleged to be violated;

10 (3) a description of the nature of the documen-  
11 tary materials, interrogatories, or oral testimony  
12 sought by the civil investigative demand;

13 (4) the number of times the Attorney General  
14 filed in a district court of the United States a peti-  
15 tion for an order for the enforcement of a civil inves-  
16 tigative demand and a detailed description of the cir-  
17 cumstances that led the Attorney General to seek  
18 such an order;

19 (5) a description of the results of civil investiga-  
20 tive demands issued, including whether the Attorney  
21 General subsequently filed charges for an alleged  
22 violation of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of  
23 1938 (22 U.S.C. 611 et seq.), regardless of whether  
24 such charges were filed against the recipient of the

1 civil investigative demand or another legal entity or  
2 natural person; and  
3 (6) any other information regarding the use of  
4 such authority that the Attorney General deems rel-  
5 evant.
